2014 Hike-a-Thon



Saturday, April 12, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., Keene, NH

The Mt Monadnock District hosts the Family Fun Walk / Hike a Thon this year in and around Stone Wall Farm in west Keene.

The hike starts and ends at Stone Wall Farm, 242 Chesterfield Rd, Keene, NH 03431

- Hike is on walking on low-traffic local roads, hiking trails and rail trail. Roads will be wet and snowy in sections.
- Bring your own lunch. No food will be served, but water refills available.
- Toilets available at the beginning, middle and end of the Hiking portion.
- This is a rain, snow or shine event
- Registration starts at 9 a.m.



Hiking – 5.00 Miles

The hike has been selected for all ages of Cubs and Boy Scouts. Not recommended for siblings younger than 6, unless carried in a child carrier. Terrain is mostly on trails and paved town roads. It's April, so expect the trail to be muddy and possibly snow covered in some areas. The elevation rise is about 200- feet over about 2 miles – less than last year.

In addition to your pledge forms, you will need to bring:

- A day pack with rain gear
- Water bottle with 1 liter of water (refills available)
- Appropriate shoes or boots
- Trail snacks
- Nutritious lunch
- Personal first aid kit

Mountain Bike Hike – 16 Miles

The bike hike is for Boy Scouts or Venturers 14 or older, and will be challenging terrain. The hike is mostly on local paved roads and some dirt town roads.

In addition to your pledge forms, you will need to bring:

- A day pack with rain gear
- Bike in good repair
- Bike repair kit
- Helmet
- Water bottle with 1 liter of water (refills available)
- Appropriate shoes or boots
- Trail snacks
- Nutritious lunch
- First aid kit



How it Works

- Open to Cub Scouts or Boy Scouts and their families
- Bikers must be 14+ (more requirements below)
- Scouts take pledges per mile hiked
- Collect money at the time of pledge. Pledge payment checks made out to your unit.
- Bring pledge sheet & money to your Pack, Den or Troop unit coordinator or treasurer.
- Unit retains 75% for the Scout toward the camp registration payment.
- Unit Coordinator brings pledge summary, blank check to "Daniel Webster Council," and roster of hikers to the hike.
- Remaining 25% supports camperships for Monadnock District boys who could not otherwise afford camp.
- Prizes for highest collected pledge total for a Tiger, Wolf, Bear, & Webelo, and for highest Boy Scout collected pledge total
